


MANIFESTATIONAL MOTIVATIONAL & MINISTRY GIFTS Part 2 Misconception between Manifestatonal Gifts Motivational Gifts and Ministry Gifts	
1.Manifestation gifts (1 Corinthians 12) 2. Ministry gifts (Ephesians 4) 3. Motivational gifts (Romans 12)	
1Corinthians 12.7 (KJV) But the manifestation of the Spirit is given to every man to profit withal	
1Corinthians 12.8 (KJV) For to one is given by the Spirit the word of wisdom; to another the word of knowledge by the same Spirit;	
. 1Corinthians 12.9 (KJV) To another faith by the same Spirit; to another the gifts of healing by the same Spirit.	
1Corinthians 12:10 (KJV) To another the working of miracles; to another prophecy; to another discerning of spirits; to another kinds of tongues; to another the interpretation of tongues.	



The word manifestation is translated from the Greek φανερωσις	
Transliteration: phanerōsis Pronunciation: fan-er'-o-sis and it means revelation,	
or appearance.	
These gifts allow us to see or to experience the power and presence of Holy Spirit in a supernatural way.	
1 Corinthians14.24 (NLT) But if all of you are prophesying, and unbelievers or people who don't understand these things come into your meeting, they will be convicted.	
1 Corinthians14.25 (NLT) As they listen, their secret thoughts will be laid bare, and they will fall down on their knees and worship God, declaring, "God is really here among you."	
These gifts are literally an appearance of the Holy Spirit. Greek word for manifestation is fan-er'-o-sis. Meaning appearance	
Ephesians 4.8 (NKJV) Therefore He says: "When He ascended on high, He led captivity captive, And gave gifts to men."	



Ephesians 4:11 (NKJV) And He Himself gave some to be apostles, some prophets, some evangelists, and some pastors and teachers,	
If you understand Greek there's something called the Granville sharp rule, which tells us that pastors and teachers are the same thing, pastors as the office while teaching is their function.	
Now these are the gifts Christ gave to the church: the apostles, the prophets, the evangelists, and the pastors and teachers. Ephesians 4:11 (NLT)	
The purpose of these gifts are not to manifest in the spirit but to perfect the saints.	
Ephesians 4.12 (KJV) For the perfecting of the saints, for the work of the ministry, for the edifying of the body of Christ:	



Romans12:7 (KJV) Or ministry, let us wait on our our ministering: or he that teacheth, on teaching	
Romans 12.8 (NKJV) he who exhorts, in exhortation; he who gives, with liberality; he who leads, with diligence; he who shows mercy, with cheerfulness.	
The gift of prophecy mentioned in Romans chapter 12 is not the same as the gift of prophecy in First Corinthians chapter 12, even though they're called by the same name.	
They both come from that root word Greek: διδάσκω Transliteration: didaskō Pronunciation: did-as'-ko.	
Greek: προφητεία Transliteration: prophēteia Pronunciation: prof-ay-ti'-ah	
INHERENT GIFTS. These are the gifts that you're born with, and as a result, you have these gifts whether your saved or not. Exhortation. Administration Mercy	



A person with the gift of mercy is able to feel what others are feeling	
Manifestation gifts First Corinthians 12 Ministry gifts Ephesians chapter four Motivational gifts in Romans chapter 12.	
1 Peter 4.10 (NKJV) As each one has received a gift, minister it to one another, as good stewards of the manifold grace of God.	
1 Peter 4.11 (NKJV) If anyone speaks, let him speak as the oracles of God. If anyone ministers, let him do it as with the ability which God supplies, that in all things God may be glorified through Jesus Christ, to whom belong the glory and the dominion forever and ever. Amen.	
Which category is Peter referring to in this passage of Scripture?
