1. Islam rejects the Trinity and the God of the Bible, insisting instead that Allah alone is the one true deity.

2. It denies that Jesus is God, that He died on the cross, and that He was raised from the dead. Instead, say Muslims, Jesus was but one of thousands of prophets sent by Allah, the greatest of them being Mohammed.

* In other words, Jesus was merely a man.

3. Islam rejects the salvation of forgiveness through Christ, teaching that only Muslims can be saved.

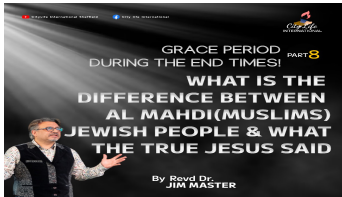
* According to the Koran, if a person follows Islam and does enough good deeds to outweigh the bad, Allah may allow him to enter paradise, but even then, he can't be sure.

4. The only sure pathway to heaven is killing and being killed in jihad, a holy war.

5. Islam gives lip service to the Bible as a holy book, but it undermines and denies every fundamental doctrine about sin and salvation taught in the Bible. Islam today is the most powerful system on earth for the destruction of biblical truth and Christianity—thousands of Christians are dying under Islamic persecution, especially in the Middle East, Africa, Indonesia, and other parts of Asia.

Islam and Christianity are mutually exclusive.

* Both claim to be the only true way to God, but both cannot be right.



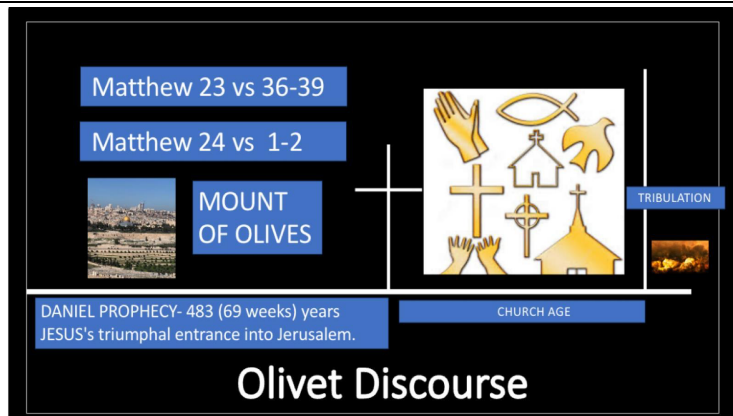

* Making these distinctions may not be politically correct, but it is critical if the purity of the gospel is to be protected.

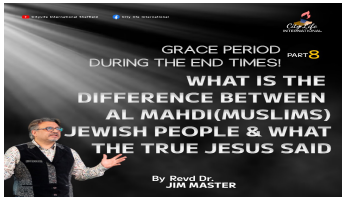

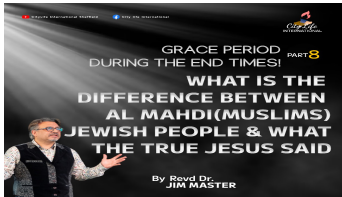
That's a one followed by 157 zeros.

Deuteronomy 12:11 (NKJV)

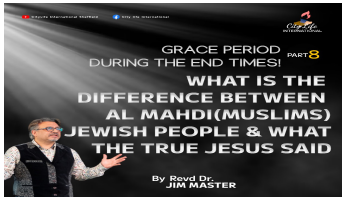

Matthew 21:33–41 (NLT)

“Now listen to another story. A certain landowner planted a vineyard, built a wall around it, dug a pit for pressing out the grape juice, and built a lookout tower. Then he leased the vineyard to tenant farmers and moved to another country. At the time of the grape harvest, he sent his servants to collect his share of the crop. But the farmers grabbed his servants, beat one, killed one, and stoned another. So the landowner sent a larger group of his servants to collect for him, but the results were the same.

“Finally, the owner sent his son, thinking, ‘Surely they will respect my son.’

38 “But when the tenant farmers saw his son coming, they said to one another, ‘Here comes the heir to this estate. Come on, let’s kill him and get the estate for ourselves!’ So they grabbed him, dragged him out of the vineyard, and murdered him. 40 “When the owner of the vineyard returns,” Jesus asked, “what do you think he will do to those farmers?” 41 The religious leaders replied, “He will put the wicked men to a horrible death and lease the vineyard to others who will give him his share of the crop after each harvest.”

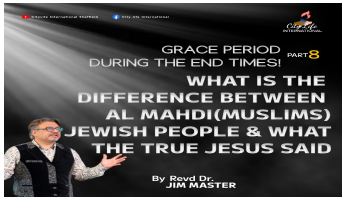
Matthew 21:43-44 (NLT)

Omnipotent - all power

The correct definition of omnipresence is that God is always everywhere, past, present, and future simultaneously.

Romans 11:25-28 (NKJV)

26 And so all Israel will be saved, as it is written:

“The Deliverer will come out of Zion And He will turn away ungodliness from Jacob;

28 Concerning the gospel they are enemies for your sake, but concerning the election they are beloved for the sake of the fathers.

The word mystery is translated from the Greek word *musterion*, and literally, what it means is something that was not revealed to previous generations, but now it's been revealed to the present generation and the future of the church is a mystery.

Number 1

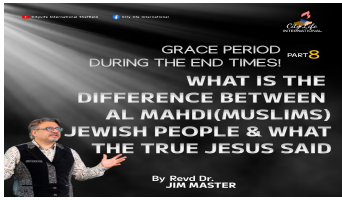
